

IGCSE Results 2016

After weeks of waiting, the June 2016 results came finally out for our 29 year 11 students and our 18 year 10 students on the morning of August 11th.

Yet again, students have done well, so congratulations to the IGCSE Class of 2015- 2016 (and year 10 students who took early exams) with 22 students receiving their ICE award diploma: 27.3% of them achieving a Distinction and 72.7% a Merit award for their ICE diploma.

This is another successful set of results for the British International School of Istanbul with 84% exam pass rate and 84% students achieving 5 or more A* to C grades, 72% students with 5 or more A* to C grades including English and Maths, 71 A* and A grades out of 251 exams (not including early entry results)
6 students gained 5 or more A* and A grades

The overall mean grade achieved by the year 11 is B.
